## (b) <u>Director's Update</u>

### Parent Engagement Survey

Beginning in the 2024-25 school year, SRPSD shifted from administering a parent engagement survey through OurSCHOOL to administering the survey internally. While the survey maintained the same themes, there were changes to the survey to remove redundant questions and proprietary information. 717 surveys were completed which is an increase from 2022-23 where 377 surveys were completed.

## (c) Global Sports Academy Update

J. Court, Superintendent of Schools, provided a report on the Global Sports Academy that included number of students involved in the hockey and multi-sport programs.

## (d) <u>Indigenous Languages Update</u>

J. Hingley, Superintendent of Schools, provided an overview the Indigenous programing in the division. SRPSD offers programming in three elementary schools (John Diefenbaker, Queen Mary and St. Louis) and three high schools (PACI, Carlton and St. Louis). Indigenous Language instruction is critical to the work of Truth and Reconciliation and to ensuring that Cree and Métis students can access culture and language to nurture the development of their cultural identity.
